St. Mark UMC Pumpkin Patch

Every year around the end of September/beginning of October we receive a full truck load of these beautiful, bright orange pumpkins for our pumpkin patch. These beautiful pumpkins come from a Navajo Indian Reservation in New Mexico. All of our pumpkins in the pumpkin patch are FOR SALE unlike some of the other pumpkin patches in our area! We have special tape measures that measure the circumference of the pumpkins to give us their price. At the end of October we send the Navajo Indian Reservation a percentage of what we collected in sales of the pumpkins and the rest is divided into different ministries at our church.

This years pumpkin patch will run from September 29th to October 31st (or until all pumpkins are sold out before). Our hours are Monday to Thursday from 2pm - 7pm and Friday to Sunday from 1pm - 8pm. There is an entrance fee of \$3.00 for anyone ages 6 years old and older. We also have some events in the patch for some businesses along with field trips for area schools, preschools, and adult day cares.

St. Mark UMC Pumpkin Patch is well known and is a blessing to our community. We have so many people who have been coming to our pumpkin patch since they were little and now they bring their kids. Being a volunteer and helping to work shifts in the patch is a joy and a blessing. You hear people from the community tell their stories about the pumpkin



patch and how they have enjoyed coming year after year. You also get to know other church members a little bit better seeing them outside of worship time. It is a great way to help the church, the Navajo Indians, and our community in volunteering. Pastor Musings From Pastor Joe, St. Mark UMC, September 2024 Prayer Campaign

"The prayer of faith will save the sick, and the Lord will raise them up; and anyone who has committed sins will be forgiven. Therefore confess your sins to one another, and pray for one another, so that you may be healed. The prayer of the righteous is powerful and effective." —James 5:15-16

Two months ago, my newsletter article focused on the need for prayer. I want to circle back to that theme as I announce an upcoming 8-day Prayer Campaign for St. Mark UMC, coordinated by Fernando Garza and I, from September 28th - October 5th. During this campaign, there will be opportunities to lament, celebrate, and seek provision for St. Mark UMC, alongside personal and community needs. We have so much to be thankful for as the church. God has been good to St. Mark UMC, allowing us to continue to worship and serve God and neighbor year after year. As our C3 team discerned this Spring, we are indeed an authentic, caring, discipline family seeking to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world.

But we also face challenges that cannot be overlooked: our Preschool is struggling financially. We have a strong spirit of volunteerism and Bible study participation, but the number of active members and worshipers has stalled. Church finances have improved modestly, but we are still stuck in a pattern of depending upon the St. Mark Foundation for loans that we don't pay back. Finally, both the church and Preschool have severely underpaid staff, and the church and Preschool have moral obligations to increase their pay as we are able to do so.

In facing these needs, we remember that our first and final need is for connection with and faithfulness to God the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. While there might be tangible things you can do to address the issues raised in this article, the main thing we need to remember is our dependence upon our Lord. So please, believe in the power of prayer, and when the specific times and resources for this Prayer Campaign details are offered, I

encourage everyone to engage in prayers of lament, celebration, and petition for what God has in store for St. Mark UMC.
