John Wesley & Voting

"In everything do to others as you would have them do for you, for this is the Law and the Prophets." --Matthew 7:12 (NRSV)

John Wesley, the founder of the Methodist movement, wrote the following in his journal on October 6, 1774: "I met those in our society who had votes in the ensuing election, and advised them (1) To vote, without fee or reward, for the person they judged most worthy, (2) To speak no evil of the person they voted against, and (3) To take care their spirits were not sharpened against those that voted on the other side."

According to my friend and colleague Wilson Pruitt, a UMC pastor in Austin who hosts *The History of Methodism* podcast, Wesley's parents had many bitter arguments, and separated on at least one occasion, over who they believed to be the lawful king of England! Wesley himself voted, according to his journal entries, and he publicly shared his opinions on a range of social and political topics, such as his opposition to slavery and child labor, and his opposition to the American Revolution (he was loyal to England, after all). Thus, Wesley not only understood the intensely divisive nature of voting and political engagement, but he saw great value in engaging in the political process anyway, guiding by the three rules he shares with fellow voters.

Now, Wesley lived in England, and British democracy in the 18th century looked very different than 21st century American democracy. For that reason, John Wesley's second point, in my opinion, could use some revision for our day, to something along the lines of "To speak no dishonest or insincere criticism of the person they voted against." You might have quibbles with particular details of his "voting rules," too. Yet I hope we can see how Wesley is trying to apply Jesus' Golden Rule to voting, just as we seek to live by the Golden Rule in every part of life. Whether we are eligible to vote or not, whether we express our political views publicly or not, may all of us seek to follow the Golden Rule, as Wesley did, in voting and in everyday life.

To start off I want to thank God for the provision of help and strength as well as resources and children that joined our program. Second, I want to thank St. Mark UMC as well as every single volunteer who helps with these ministries because it really does take a good God and community loving team to run a successful sports ministry, or any ministry for that matter.
