



Thoughts and Advice from Pastor Joe, St. Mark UMC, March 2025 Why Lent?

"Then Jesus was led up by the Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil. He fasted for forty days and forty nights, and afterwards he was famished."—Matthew 4:1-2. NRSV

For much of global Christianity, Ash Wednesday (March 5 this year) marks the beginning of a "40 day" season called "Lent," leading up to Easter Sunday (April 20 this year). If you look at a calendar, it's actually a 46 day period, but since Lent is a time of repentance, fasting, and critical self-reflection, Sundays are excluded from the count of "Lent" days, because we always celebrate Jesus' resurrection on Sunday. The vast majority of United Methodist congregations, along with other liturgically focused Protestant denominations (Presbyterian, Lutheran, Episcopalian/Anglican, Disciples of Christ, etc.), join our Catholic and Orthodox siblings in Christ in observing these "40 days," with a particular focus on the weight of sin and our need for the cross of Christ for forgiveness and salvation.

Jesus' 40 days in the wilderness, which began his public ministry after his baptism, is not the only time we see 40 associated with repentance, renewal, and spiritual growth in the Bible. Moses spent 40 days on Mt. Sinai with the Lord to receive instructions for the new worship space, the tabernacle (Exodus 24:18). God commanded the Israelites to spend 40 years in the desert prior to entering the Promised Land, in response to their attempted rebellion (Numbers 14:33-34). The prophet Elijah, in despair and exile despite a victory over Baal worshipers, spent 40 days fasting prior to encountering the Lord on Mt. Horeb (1 Kings 19:8).

The sinful people of Nineveh spent 40 days in repentance and fasting to avoid God's punishment (Jonah 3:4-5).

During this season of Lent, may we find ways to repent of our sins and failings, and seek the unconditional and extravagant grace and mercy of God in Jesus Christ, by the power of that same Holy Spirit that sent Jesus into the wilderness almost 2,000 years ago.
