Pastor Musings Thoughts and Advice from Pastor Joe, St. Mark UMC, October 2023 God Still Calls Today, & God Still Calls Through You

When Pastor Sharon served here as interim pastor during the first half of 2022, she introduced a time of personal testimony during worship called "God Still Calls Today." When I started as pastor in June 2022, I kept this practice, but only once a month. Upon reflection, I think reducing God Still Calls to once per month was a mistake. Starting this month, we will have God Still Calls testimonies every other week in worship, because God does, indeed, still calls us today. Yet I know that we might struggle to get folks to sign up to offer such testimonies. Many of y'all are hesitant to share something as personal as your experiences of God. Yet offering such testimonies helps our community grow in our love for God and one another. Thus, here are 3 things that can help anyone share how God Still Calls in their life.

(1) **Start with stories and examples from your life.** 1 Peter 3:15, encourages us to "give the reason for the hope that you have." Testimonies are about why you sincerely hope in Christ.

(2) **Testify to what God has done in your life.** In Acts 4:20, Peter and John declare, "For we cannot help speaking about what we have seen and heard." Focus on how your faith journey has led you to experience God's love, forgiveness, and transformation through Christ.

(3) **Prayer is essential when testifying,** as it invites the Holy Spirit to guide you. Seek God's guidance before speaking and ask for God's wisdom to communicate effectively.

Testifying about one's experiences of God the Father, Son, & Holy Spirit can feel intimidating. By speaking **from your life about God from a place of deep prayer**, your presence and witness help us as members of our St. Mark UMC family grow in our love for God, one another, and the larger world.
