Safe Gatherings is an organization that provides Churches and Schools training and resources to help ensure the safety of children, youth and vulnerable adults. It focuses on preventing and addressing issues such as abuse, neglect, and exploitation.

Safe Gatherings Mission - Screen and educate staff and volunteers to help prevent abuse of children, youth, and vulnerable adults.

Safe Gatherings Vision - A world in which all children, youth, and vulnerable adults are protected and feel safe.

Parents want to know that their children are safe when they are attending church or other places in the community and schools. To help these parents who bring their children & youth to St. Mark UMC we ask all staff and volunteers who will be working around children & youth to be Safe Gatherings Certified.

Safe Gatherings is simple and is done all online. It teaches abuse prevention training, background checks, reference checks for all staff and volunteers who work with children, youth, and

vulnerable adults. If you plan to help and volunteer at any of St. Mark UMC children or youth events please go to safegatherings.com and start your application process. Once you are Safe Gatherings Certified you are good for 2 years then you will have to renew every 2 years. Any questions you can contact the church office at 956-682-1481.

Pastor Musings

From Pastor Joe, St. Mark UMC, May 2024 Circling Back: Generosity, C3, United Methodist Church, & Jesus' Victory over Satan

"What has been is what will be, and what has been done is what will be done; there is nothing new under the sun." - Ecclesiastes 1:9 NRSV

While I'm not usually as pessimistic as the lament expressed in the Scripture passage above, there is, in fact, very little new per se in my newsletter article this month. It has been an action-packed four months, so I thought I would simply follow up with what I've written in each month's newsletter so far:

Generosity (January): It has been such a joy to experience and celebrate the generosity of this congregation! Our revenues have surpassed last year's revenues at this point in the year. Additionally, even as circumstances have limited our ability to engage fully in fundraising for the Capital Campaign, we already have over \$12,000 for the Campaign. THANK YOU!! Remember, this year, Campaign funds will go toward Trustee and General Reserves; next year, we will seek to re-pay our financial debt to the Foundation to enable the Foundation to expand outreach ministry investments; and the following year, we hope to raise funds for specific capital improvement projects. THANK YOU FOR YOUR GENEROSITY AND KEEP IT UP!

Courageous Congregations Collaborative (February): This small cohort (Me, Ed Keebaugh, Nancy Murray, Jessica Flores, Moises Liñan, Lisa Gonzalez, & Romeo Robles Jr.) has met several times since January by Zoom with cohorts from First UMC-Corpus Christi & Sulphur Springs UMC, to explore together what it means to "exercise muscles" of vital congregations. In the process, a few of us will go to Houston in a few weeks for a Learning Experience. We have also received a \$5,000 microgrant to launch a new outreach ministry. As of now, we are drafting a grant application to expand our sports ministries, so that Moises & Aleythia would have start-up funds to engage in St. Mark-sponsored sports ministry in the broader community. Please pray for this endeavor!

<u>United Methodist Church (March)</u>: The General Conference of the UMC ends on May 3. While not all legislative work has been completed, we know that the fruit of this work will be a world-wide denomination that will clarify the essentials of the United Methodist tradition while granting freedom to United Methodists in North America, Africa, Europe, and Asia to engage in ministry that best suits their context. We will also be a denomination that is more inclusive of our LGBTQ+ siblings in Christ.

Atonement (April): There is literally nothing new to report here, except that our celebration of Christ's resurrection continues through May 19, which is Pentecost Sunday. Also, for those who are curious, the "atonement theory" I appreciate the most is Christus Victor, as summarized by 1 Corinthians 15:54-57: "Death has been swallowed up in victory. Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?' The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. But thanks be to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ."
